LEARNING A FOREIGN LANGUAGE THROUGH THE INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY ACCOMPANIED WITH THE INTERCULTURAL ELEMENTS

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Abstract

The paper "Learning a foreign language through the information and communication technology accompanied with the intercultural elements" deals with the significant contribution that ICT can provide to teaching and learning in English foreign language classrooms.
